Keatly-Reynolds Stone House

c. 1830

Dr. Joseph Reynolds owned this two story stone house along with fifty-nine acres in 1877. (Lake, Griffing and Stevenson Atlas) The doctor, according to the patron list was a Lancaster Co. resident until 1860 when he moved to the Rock Springs area. A William Keatly appears on the 1858 Martenet Map.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Keatly-Reynolds House c. 1825-1850 is a 2<sup>1/2</sup> story hall/parlor/center <sup>1321</sup> fieldstone house on New Bridge Road a mile east of the intersection with Connelly Road. The house sits in an overgrown area that is almost invisible when the foliage is out. The house has been vacant a number of years and has been vandalized extensively. The structure faces south with the main gable running east/west.

The 2<sup>1/2</sup> story fieldstone structure is 3 bays across by one room deep. A 2 story ell addition extends off the north side and is 1 bay across by one room deep. The structure naturally rests on a stone foundation and is covered with a medium sloped slate roof.

The main facade is three bays across with a central entrance. The main door is gone but the molded door surround remains. It has a ogee molded backband with beaded inside corners. A few 6/6 sash windows with wooden lintels remain. The boxed cornice is plain.

The east and west gable ends are fairly plain with a few first and second floor windows and 4 pane attic lights. The chimney stacks above the roofline have deteriorated.

The interior has been fairly well stripped of its original woodwork. The window reveals do have curved corners. A central stair does divide the two rooms but has lost its balustrade.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Keatly-Reynolds House is presently in such a sad state of repair that it has lost most of its architectural merit. The house will undoubtedly disappear due to its unretrievable condition.

The house in its day, however, was very significant in the Conowingo area. It is not only one of the few houses constructed entirely of stone but also one of the earlier in the general vicinity.


