DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Emory-Carnes House c. 1860 is a two story five bay center stair single pile frame house located off Earleville Road and just west of Scotchman's Creek. The house faces ~~south~~ <sup>west</sup> with a main gable running ~~east west~~ <sup>north south</sup>.

The main block has an ell addition, three bay across by one room deep. The house rests on a brick and fieldstone foundation and covered with the original weatherboard. The corrugated tin roof has a medium slope.

The south (main) facade is typically symmetrical with its central entrance and 6/6 sash windows. The trim is plain and four panel front door has a two light transom. A plain boxed cornice stretches across above the second floor sash. A three bay front porch with chamfered posts and stick corner brackets.

The west end has no openings. A plain bargeboard closes the gable end with a brick interior end stack rising out of the gable. The west gable end is identical.

The north (back) side of the house has two bays exposed with the rest covered with the kitchen ell. The ell is slightly shorter in elevation with a plain north end with interior brick stack. Access is gained through a kitchen door which opens onto a shed porch that extends the full length of the wing and is supported by square posts. There is a simple boxed cornice. The windows are an expected 6/6 sash. A large picture window has been cut through the east wall.

The interior of the main block has in primarily plain with molded door and window surrounds. There are no mantels, only holes for stove pipes. Four panel doors are found throughout. The kitchen wing is basically plain with simple board doors and plain surrounds.

A few outbuildings remain with the farmhouse. A small meat house is found directly north of the kitchen. One small barn and four bay wagon sheds are located northwest of the house. They are covered with vertical board siding.
