

The Wirt-Gosnay farmhouse provides a rare mingling of two architectural traditions. The internal three room central chimney plan is derived from a continental European origin while the three bay symmetrically oriented main elevation descends from an English tradition of building. It seems that the builders of this house were influenced enough by English predominance in Cower Cecil County to orient the main elevation like other houses in the area that have an English background. The central chimney and radiating three room plan is definitely a continental plan and not from the English vocabulary of house construction.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Gosnay House c. 1850 is a 2½ story three bay by two room house on Bohemia Church Road and west of Warwick, Md. The house faces south with the main gable running east/west.

The main block has a two story three bay by one room ell kitchen wing that extends northward. The kitchen wing is supported by a full fieldstone foundation with a crawl space under the front block. The house is totally covered by asbestos over weatherboard. A steeply pitched composition tile roof covers both sections.

The south facade is three bays across with an entrance in the western most bay. A heavily molded four panel door has a two light transom and plain pilasters with a simple ½ inch round capital and molded lintel. 6/6 sash windows occupy the two eastern bays with two panel shutters and plain surrounds. The western opening on the second floor has been enlarged to a double 4/4 sash with louvered shutters. The original 6/6 sash occupy the two eastern openings. A small boxed cornice with bed molding stretches across at the base of the roof. A shed roof front porch covers the first floor and is supported by chamfered posts. A saw-toothed end board decorates the ends. The east gable end has an entrance gabled stoop and balustrade between support posts. The eave is closed by a simple bargeboard.

The western end has some later first and second floor sash and two four pane attic sash. There is a central stretcher bond stove stack.

The north side of the main block is primarily covered with the kitchen ell but a 6/6 sash lights the first and second floor hall (see floor plan).

The kitchen wing is basically detailed with 2/2 sash windows and a shed porch that extends across the eastern side. A single flue stove stack rises out of the center of the ell. The gable end has a single 2/2 sash on each floor with extended eaves.

The interior of this house does not conform to any floorplans typically used in Cecil County. A central stack provides heat for two main rooms on the first floor. A small entrance hall provides access to both rooms but not to the second floor. The main stair is located in a back hall behind the front parlor.

The stair has a square newel with slightly beveled cap which supports a simple handrail. The rectangular balusters are set into a straight stringer with a beaded board fill under the stringer. The door surrounds have an ovolo backband with beaded corner which frame six panel doors with interior locks. The mantels have been removed from the main rooms. A elaborate Adamesque Revival mantel is found in the main parlor.

The ovolo molded surrounds are also found on the second floor but *frame* beaded board doors instead of paneled ones. The open stair rises to the full attic. The rafters have mortise and tenon joists.

The kitchen wing consists of two rooms on each floor. the south room being a dining room. A simple mid 19th century mantel is found in this room. The kitchen is typically plain with beaded board doors and plain trim. A small winder stair provides access to the second floor. A small meat house is located directly north of the kitchen wing. Typical farm structures are found farther north of the main house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Wirt-Gosnary House seems to ^{be} a mid to late 19th century variation of the ^{partially with} German plan house with central chimney and three rooms. The once asymmetrical ^{facade} has been given ^{the symmetrical three bay} facade. The only difference is the central chimney. Third quarter of the 19th century exterior detailing contrasts to the somewhat earlier ovolo moldings and six panel doors. It is unfortunate the mantels have been removed. The three room plan is extremely rare in the southern reaches of Cecil County. This being one of two known examples.


