DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

WILSON PRICE HOUSE

The Wilson-Price house is a product of the joining of two houses in the late 19th Century. According to the owners one section was moved from another part of the farm and joined to the existing structure. The house was remodeled in the past few years but a few details remain of the 19th Century structure. The farmhouse faces north with the main gable running east/west and parallel with Edgar Price Road. The road used to run directly in front of the house but was subsequently moved 100 yards to the north in the not too distant past.

The first structure, according to the owner was a two and one-half story three bay by one room hall/parlor frame house. The addition consisted of a two and one-half story two bay by one room frame section to the east. The entire structure is covered with an asbestos tile sheathing and rests on a fieldstone foundation. The composition tile roof has a steep pitch and a central cross gable.

The north side is presently five full bays with a central 20th Century colonial entrance. Turned 19th Century porch posts were cut down and used as supports for a waist high railing. The window sash have been replaced with a six-over-six division except for the cross gable light which is a two-over-two sash. Some molded trim remains and paneled and louvered shutters are found on the first and second floor windows. The two western bays of both floor have star shaped shutter dogs which are not present on the eastern bays. A stuccoed interior stack rises out of the center of the house, and a exterior brick stack has been added to the east end. The gable ends are basically plain with six pane attic lights on the west end and four pane lights on the east end. The eaves are extended and the rafter ends left exposed.

The south side is primarily covered with an extensively remodeled two story T kitchen wing. A single story porch is attached to the east side of the kitchen. Six-over-six sash remain with molded trim and louvered shutters.

The interior of the main block has been remodeled on the first floor. An enclosed stair rises between the two ~~end~~ rooms. Mid to late 19th Century moldings are found in the west parlor along with a late 19th Century mantel with fluted side supports and fluted shelf brackets and a decorated frieze. The attic provided evidence for the joining of the two structures with uneven flooring between the third and fourth bays from the west.

Usual mid to late barn buildings include a large cow barn, wagon sheds, and a meat house. They are all built with a timber frame and sheathed with vertical board siding.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The present structure has lost most of its 19th Century architectural importance as a county farmhouse. It does appear on the 1877 Lake Atlas under the name of William Wilson, and was transferred to William Price by a George W. Laurason in 1893 for \$8,750. The property is located on a late 19th Century survey along with the adjoining farms under the title of Painter's Rest No. 1.


