DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Milestone No. 0(1), a replacement monument of 1849, marks the northeast corner of Maryland, the end point of Mason and Dixon's North Line (Monument No. 87) and the beginning point of their West Line. It is one of 24 monuments ~~and sites~~ ^{now marking} the Cecil/Chester and Lancaster county boundary at mile intervals; and replaces the double crownstone set by the commissioners in 1768, which by the time of the Graham resurvey of the North Line in 1849 was said to have disappeared.

The area here is still predominantly rural, gently rolling farmland, with housing scattered almost entirely along main roads, except for the extensive new residential development along Little Egypt Road coming up to within about a ½ mile of the boundary. The site is located about 2 miles northeast of Appleton, MD; about ½ mile northwest of Mechanicsville, Delaware; nearly a mile south-southeast of Strickersville, Pennsylvania; about 700' northeast of the junction of Little Egypt Road with MD 896; on the south bank of a small stream at the bottom of a wooded slope; only about 15' downstream from a pile of brush and debris. It cannot be seen from the road, and is inconspicuous when closeby. It is endangered by neglect, erosion of the bank site by the stream, wash from the hillside, and the dumping upstream.

The monument stands about 2½' above ground, probably close to its original height, is in place, firmly set, and is in comparatively good condition, though with chips along all edges and top corners. It is a plain but dressed ^{squared} granite post, about 14" ^{wide on} each side, and has a low pyramidal top with centered apex, capped by a US C&GS metal reference disk stamped "M.D.P. CORNER/NO 2/1935". The only embellishments are blocky V-cut capital letters (P on the north side facing Pennsylvania, with the date 1849 cut below; P on the east side, facing the earlier provincial lands administered by the Penns at the time of the Mason-Dixon survey; and the letter M on the south and west sides).

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Milestone No. O(1), although a replacement in 1849 of the original Mason and Dixon double crownstone set in 1768, is significant as a key tri-state boundary monument. For Maryland and Pennsylvania, it not only marks the site of the northern terminus of Mason and Dixon's north-south line between the two colonial provinces (and ^{states} until 1921), but also the beginning point of the West Line, commonly known since Civil War times as the Mason-Dixon Line. For Delaware, No. O(1) has also marked that State's northwest corner (since 1921, when the triangular sliver of land known as "The Wedge" (containing 714 acres) was formally declared by the U.S. Congress to be a part of Delaware, rather than Pennsylvania.
