DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Reynolds-Boyd House c. 1910-1915 is at least the second structure on this property that was used as a residence. The one on the 1877 map burned and according to the owner this three story tyree bay by one room course common brick house was built in its place.

The brick house rests on a fieldstone foundation and is covered with a slate mansard roof. The house has a southern exposure with the main gable running east/west. It is located on Ridge Road and northwest of Rising Sun.

The southern elevation has a central entrance with glazed door which is flanked by single pane sidelights. A three light transom is found overhead. A projecting two story bay window occupies the eastern of the three bays. The western bay has a single 2/2 sash. Each opening has a brick jack arch above. A boxed cornice with crown molding separates the second floor from the mansard roof. The south elevation of the roof is pierced by three 2/2 sash gabled dormers. The first floor is completely covered by a shed roof porch which extends around to the eastern side and also protects the side entrance. The porch roof is supported by turned posts.

The east end, in addition to the entrance under the post has a second floor window and attic light. The same is found on the north side of the interior end brick chimney.

The west end ^{has} ~~and~~ two 2/2 sash on all three floors and two six pane basement windows which flank the chimney. (GABLED ATTIC DORMERS)

The north side is similarly detailed with a central door opening and flanking 2/2 sash and three windows on the second and attic floors. (GABLED ATTIC DORMERS)

The interior consists of a central stair with flanking rooms. The woodwork is typical of the turn of the 20th century.

A large stone and frame barn stands southeast of the house. The east wall is primarily stone while the rest being frame. A granary and wagon sheds are situated north of the barn.

The Reynolds-Boyd farmhouse is a form that was introduced with the Second-Empire architectural style of the third quarter of the 19th century. ~~This early 20th century farmhouse exemplifies how stylish forms remain fashionable in rural areas long after they have been replaced with newer forms in the cities.~~ The structure has changed little since its 1910-1920 construction date.
