The infirmery of the Tome School for Boys was one of the original elements of Boring and Tilton's plan for the school. Its Colonial Revival architecture reflects the Beaux-Arts classicism of the rest of the school buildings.

The former infirmery building is a 2½ story frame building with a two-story columned portico and one-story wings flanking the main section. The building was originally located about 200 yards southwest of its present position. It is now located off Tome Road, facing south, on the grounds of the Susquehanna-Chesapeake Job Corps Center (formerly Bainbridge Naval Training Center).

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The former infirmary building is a 2½ story frame building with a two-story columned portico and one-story wings flanking the main section. The building was originally located about 200 yards southwest of its present position. It is now located off Tome Road, facing south, on the grounds of the Susquehanna-Chesapeake Job Corps Center (formerly Bainbridge Naval Training Center).

The gable roof has three dormers on the front elevation with paired windows in each. The present roof is modern composition material. The exterior covering is clapboard.

The original plan of the infirmary contained two wards in the flanking wings as well as isolation rooms, a kitchen, examination rooms, a reception room, and living quarters for the resident nurse and a practical nurse. The infirmary was moved to its present location prior to 1942 and converted to four apartments between 1942 and 1946. During this renovation, the outer two dormers were apparently added, since early views of the infirmary show only one central dormer.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The infirmary of the Tome School for Boys was one of the original elements of Boring and Tilton's plan for the school. Its Colonial Revival architecture reflects the Beaux-Arts classicism of the rest of the school buildings.

The Board of Trustees, in their efforts to plan for every aspect of the care and education of the boys, included an infirmary in their earliest discussions of the school buildings. Its original location near the athletic field behind Monroe Hall was intended to be convenient for injuries on the playing fields and at the same time removed from the rest of the school buildings to help prevent epidemics of childhood diseases.

The infirmary was subsequently converted to four apartments for officers by the Navy.
