The initial stage of this two-story, two-part frame house is believed to have been built by members of the Harrison family. Walter Harrison, a late 18th century rector of Durham Church, and Robert Hanson Harrison, an aide-de-camp to General Washington during the Revolutionary War, are believed to have lived here at various times. The structure has been altered in both the late 19th and early 20th centuries.


