DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Pierson House is a two-storey frame building with a gable roof and clapboard siding. It is three bays long by two deep with a two-storey rear wing. The gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles with lacy gingerbread beneath the eaves. There are pendants at the corners of the roof and finials at the apex of the gable ends of the house. The western most bay of the house extends to the south and has a one-storey bay window on it. From this extension a one-storey porch runs across the facade. The porch has chamfered wooden posts with a hand rail connecting them. The front entrance has sidelights and a transom. The window sash is 2/2 with lancet windows in the attic. The windows have paneled shutters on the first storey and louvered shutters on the second. The front section of the house has an interior brick chimney. On the east gable end is a one-storey bay window with small brackets under the edge of the roof.

The rear wing is built of the same materials with an inside end chimney in the north gable end. The house has a stone foundation. This house dates from the mid-19th Century and is in very good condition. The interior of the house was not open for investigation.
