In 1881, Jesse T. H. Davis sold the property of **3332 Uniontown Road** to the Trustees of St. Paul's Lutheran Church for the purpose of erecting a parsonage. This house was built shortly thereafter at the cost of \$1675. While the house has standard features for frame construction of this period, it is interesting to note the placement of chimneys in this house which indicate a change in room arrangement from the early houses. The early houses generally had chimneys at the gable end where a working fireplace or ten-plate stove would be situated for heating the room. In 3332 Uniontown Road, the central location of two chimneys indicates the use of late nineteenth century stoves for heating the house and the likelihood of a central hall floor plan. The sash windows and molded cornices are typical ornamentation for this period. Mrs. Mary B. Fogle, who lived here while her father was pastor of St. Paul's during the turn-of-the-century, remembers that the parlor of the house was a popular retreat for the women in town who were frightened by lightening and thunder storms. Popular, that is, until a telephone was installed in the house that sent a shower of sparks throughout the parlor during one storm.


