DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Fenwick house is a turn-of-the-century frame structure, elaborate for the area. It is essentially a two-story cube with a five-sided tower (octagonal plan) at the northwest corner. The first story porch with low shed roof on Tuscan columns/continues along the north and west elevation. The roof is hipped with a large central gable dormer on the north, a smaller one on the east elevation, located toward the south end. The tower roof is an octagonal based tall tent which intersects the main roof and flares at the eaves. A simple dentil cornice is continuous below the eaves. The wall surfaces of the dormers have elaborate shingling and decorative stick-work and cutouts at the peak. Fenestration is 1/1. The exterior has been sided with asbestos shingles, and there is a recent shed dormer on the south. There is a screened porch along the rear (south) first story with roof hipped to the wall. The house has been divided, first and second floors, into two apartments. Significant interior details include double sliding parlor doors and the main stairs in the central hall.


