The Old Warfieldsburg School is a representative late nineteenth century schoolhouse. Built in 1878, it replaced a small log schoolhouse that stood north of the village on the road to Westminster (the first schoolhouse is shown on the 1862 and 1877 maps). The brick schoolhouse, although now used as a private residence, shows the features typical of school construction of the period with its scale, proportion, fenestration and siting.
