Green Street was laid out fully about a century after Main Street in Westminster. Thus, it is not surprising that while building forms are similar to those on Main Street, there are occasionally great differences, or at least great variations on the earlier theme. Number 137, although it is basically attentive to local tradition, departs from the norm in its siting (it is set back off the street). Otherwise the two-sectioned three-bay-by-two-bay two story building is standard; standard, that is, except for variations of the interesting curved trim of the porch, and the stained glass dormer windows on the principal facade.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Number 137 East Green Street sits on the northwest corner of the intersection of that street and Lincoln Road in Westminster. The house, as a rarity in Westminster, sits back off the road in a large shaded tree lot.

Although the siting is unusual, the form of the house is not. It consists of two perpendicular gable roofed sections, the front one being 2½ stories tall and 3 bays by 2 bays in volume; the rear is two sections with similar dimensions. The entrance door, which sits behind a deep porch about 4' off the ground, is a double late Victorian door beneath a wide rectangular transom. The other ground story bays are glass and aluminum elongated storm windows. Above are three regularly placed 2/2 windows. All windows have green louvered shutters and are simply enframed above white wooden sills. The flat roofed porch is supported by plain posts with interestingly curved woodwork rising from 3/4 of the height of the post, creating an arch at the cornice of the porch and bending down to the next post. Two gable-roofed dormer windows pierce the slate roof; the dormers have casement stained glass windows. A thick corbel capped chimney rises at right angles with the roofs ridge about halfway down the ridge.

The east facade of the principal section continues the modillioned cornice line of the main facade; below it are two regularly placed 2/2 windows per floor treated similarly to those on the main facade. The west facade of the principal section is blind except for a round four-light attic window. The cornice continues back along the rear section. The east facade of the rear section has three 2/2 windows per floor treated similarly to those earlier discussed, as are the two windows on the second floor of the west facade.

A hipped roof square oriel is on the ground floor of the west facade; there are two double hung sash windows on the west facade of it.

John Fisher's widow, Annie E. M. Fisher sold lots 16, 17, 18 and 19 of Fisher's Addition to Emily J. Rinehart and Maria Wampler on April 24, 1876 for \$240 (Carroll County Deed Book 34, Page 405). This was clearly to be used as rental property. Then, in 1886, the lots were sold to Joseph B. Boyle for \$1700 (64/421); they would stay in the Boyle family until 1975. It must have been Boyle who built no. 137 East Green Street, as it is ^{not} shown on the 1876 plat or on the 1881 City Directory. Norman B. Boyle died August 14, 1974 and Rowland Morrow, as personal representative, sold the lots to the present owners on May 30, 1975.
