The Young Frame Barn is a bank barn located on the south side of Uniontown Road at the intersection with Royer Road. The barn is a representative bank barn type from the late nineteenth century. It is a large structure that is timber-framed covered in vertical board siding. The forebay runs the full length of the eastern side of the barn. The barn contains little ornamentation reflecting its functional design.
