Brilhart's Mill is a mid-19th century mill that was in existence at least as early as 1862, when it appear on Martenet's Map of Carroll County as a grist and saw mill owned by Issac Green. In 1866, it was purchased by Michael S. Brilhart who rebuilt the mill structure to its present condition. It later required reconstruction on the interior because of damage by three separate fires during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. It remained in operation by the Brilhart family until the late 1930s.

The mill structure is a representative example of the mid-19th century, two and one-half story grist mill popular throughout Carroll County. Its foundation level is constructed of stone and the upper two stories of common bond brick. It has a gable roof and the north gable end has central doors on the two stories and in the gable. This mill was damaged by three separate fires during the late 19th and early 20th centuries, and its interior construction dates from the early 20th century. It is now used as a agricultural storage building and does not contain any milling machinery.

Summary: Brillhart's Mill is an example of the mid-19th century, two and one-half story grist mill popular throughout Carroll County. Its foundation level is constructed of stone and the upper two stories of common bond brick. It has a gable roof and the north gable end has central doors on the two stories and in the gable. This mill was damaged by three separate fires during the late 19th and early 20th centuries, and its interior construction dates from the early 20th century. It is now used as a agricultural storage building and does not contain any milling machinery.

Description: Brillhart's Mill is located on the east side of Brodbeck Road, approximately .1 mile south of Maryland Route 482, west of Hampstead. The mill is located on the east side of the East Branch which runs in a north-south direction. There is a barn and two farmhouses located with the property which is identified with the street number 1311 Brodbeck Road.

The mill structure is representative of the brick grist mills constructed during the 19th century throughout this region. It is a two and one-half story structure built in a rectangular plan. The building is three bays by four bays with a gable roof. The foundation story is constructed of uncoursed fieldstone with large stone quoins. The building is set into a slope so that the foundation level is under ground on the east elevation, and the ground slopes down on the north and south elevations. On the west elevation, there is an entrance to the ground level and three windows.

The north gable end provided a pulley overhang for unloading wagons and moving materials to each floor. Thus the central bay in each story has an entrance, with windows located in the outer bays of each story. The east elevation has a ground level entrance on the first story and windows in the other bays. On the south gable end, a one story shed with wagon shed on the foundation level was added in the 20th century.

The interior of the structure was gutted by several fires and was rebuilt in the early 20th century. It is now used as a agricultural storage building and does not contain any milling machinery.

History: The 1862 Martenet's Map of Carroll County shows this site as the grist and saw mill of Issac Green. In 1866, it was purchased by Michael S. Brilhart who rebuilt the mill structure to its present condition. The property is shown as Brilhart's Mill in the 1877 Atlas of Carroll County, and M. S. Brilhart is a patron of the Atlas listed a a miller born in York County, Pennsylvania.

According to Prall's Mills and Memories, there were two fires in the mill during the late 19th century. In 1913, a third fire occurred after which the interior was rebuilt by Michael Brilhart's son, David.
