The small silo is a one-story circular structure located northwest of Staffhouse #9. Constructed of rubblestone, the structure dates back to the Springfield farm of the mid-19th century. Similar to the stone dairy building, the silo displays the same rubblestone construction. The circular wall rises approximately five feet before a sheet metal, pyramidal roof projects above the wooden cornice. The roof culminates in a metal, circular peak. There is one opening on the structure—a wooden door which has been sealed with plywood.
