A cross gable house set at 45° angle to road. Built in form of cross. Two stories high with gable roof. Each of four sections of house is a rectangle with a square in center. There is a bay type enclosure in the front corner with entrance on first floor and three windows 2/1 on second floor. Gable roof over bay with fancy vergeboard. Exterior chimney on north side.




