The Glendy Larrimore house is the fourth house from the water on the east side of the Fairbank Road in the village of Fairbank on Tilghman Island, Talbot County, Maryland. The two-and-a-half story frame house faces west with the gable oriented on a north/south axis.

Built in the early 1900s, the Larrimore house is a three bay, frame house clad in weatherboard. The house is supported by a brick pier foundation and the roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

The west (main) facade has a central sidelighted door with a three light transom and flanking two-over-two sash windows with wide surrounds and crown mouldings. The front door is original and has a glazed upper panel and decoratively carved lower panel. A porch extends across the full width of the first floor which has turned supports, decorative brackets, and a square post balustrade. The second floor is lit by three two-over-two sash windows. The open eave displays exposed rafter feet and the central cross gable at the attic story has a small two-over-two sash window inset.

The two bay north elevation has two-over-two sash windows on both the first and second floors. An interior chimney rises above the edge of the north gable end.

The east (rear) elevation has a one-story, shed addition across the two southern bays flanked to the north by one two-over-two sash window. Formerly a porch, this addition is now enclosed and serves as a kitchen. The second floor has three two-over-two sash windows and an open eave with exposed rafter feet.

The south elevation has a pair of two-over-two sash windows on the first and second floors and an interior chimney at this gable end.

The interior of the house appears to have most of its original pine paneling on the first floor.



The Larrimore house was built in the early 1900s just before the marriage of Glendy Larrimore. Like the other houses of Fairbank built at this time, it demonstrates the simplicity and dignity of vernacular craftsmanship. Its interior pine paneling and front door detail are unique, and its uniform setback and massing contributes to the community streetscape.

The Larrimore lot extends all the way back to a pier in Black Walnut Cove where Stanley Larrimore, Glendy's grandson, moors his skipjack today.
