Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The William Roe house is located on the south side of Gibsontown Road in the village of Tilghman on Tilghman Island, Talbot County, MD. The Roe house faces north, with the principal gable oriented on an east/west axis.

Built around 1880-1890, this two-story, frame house is clad in weatherboard and roofed with asphalt shingles. It is supported by a low brick pier foundation.

The three bay north (main) facade of the house has a central door flanked by six-over-six windows on the first floor with three six-over-six sash windows on the second floor. Cornerboards mark the separation of this section of the house from a two-story, one bay addition on the east end. This addition is lit by one six-over-six window on both the first and second floors.

The east gable end has one six-over-six sash window on the second floor and a pair of one-over-one sash windows with metal awnings on the first floor.

The south (rear) elevation has a shed roof addition built in the early 1940s across the first floor. The central bay of the second story projects slightly and is lit by one six-light window. This bay is flanked on either side by a six-over-six sash window.

The west elevation is lit by a pair of one-over-one sash windows with metal awnings on the first floor.

The interior was not seen.



William Roe built this house sometime before his son was born in 1901. Roe added the two-story, one bay eastern addition to the house sometime later, and further additions were made to the rear of the house in the 1940s. The Roe house is one of a collection of two-story, three bay frame houses which comprise the older housing stock of Tilghman Island.
