The Jackson Store is located on the south side of Talbot Street in Claiborne, Talbot County, Maryland. This structure is shaped like an "L" with the principle gable oriented on an east/west axis. The house faces north.

Built around 1900, the Jackson Store is a two-and-a-half story frame structure sheathed in cream-colored aluminum siding and roofed with asphalt shingles. The foundation consists of brick piers infilled with concrete.

The north (main) elevation has a porch which extends across the entire first floor of the house. The western half of this porch is screened, and the eastern half is enclosed in wood shingles. The screened western half has a nine-light over two-panel door with two-light sidelights and one two-over-two sash window with black, louvered shutters. The enclosed end extends to the east beyond the main body of the house and has a parapet front. This eastern, one-story wing has a central, modern door flanked on either side by one one-over-one sash window with narrow surrounds. The second floor of the main body of the house is lit by three two-over-two sash windows with black, louvered shutters. All the windows on the structure have narrow surrounds. The roof line is finished with a boxed cornice, and an interior brick chimney rises from the center of the roof.

The east elevation has a one-story, shed roof addition projecting from the northern bay of the house lit by one two-over-two sash window with black, louvered shutters. To the south of the addition, the house is lit by one two-over-two sash window with black, louvered shutters. The second story is lit by four two-over-two sash windows with black, louvered shutters. The northern, two-bay, gable end of the house is lit by one two-over-two sash window at the attic level and has boxed cornice returns.

The south elevation has a two bay, gable end as its eastern most bay. The first floor of this wing is pierced with a modern door which opens onto a small wooden deck. The gable is finished with boxed cornice returns and has an interior brick chimney. The first floor of the main body of the house has a one-story, shed roof addition sheathed in weatherboard and aluminum siding and supported by a cinderblock foundation. This addition, built in the 1920s, has three one-over-one sash windows and a modern entrance door on the south side. There is a second modern door and one-over-one sash

Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

The present owners of the Jackson Store purchased this property fifteen years ago. The history of the property was succinctly described in 1970 by Lida Smith who wrote in her remembrances of Claiborne, "This house was a large boarding house built by Mr. Horney and wife of St. Michaels. It was later run by Mrs. Sears and daughter, and was finally reconstructed into a dwelling with a large storeroom first occupied by Mr. Farlow, later by Mr. Jackson, then by Mr. Yerby. They sold to Mr. Bernard Rich whose health failed, and he sold to Mrs. Richardson, then to Mr. Fick. This business has been discontinued for some time and the house is a residence for tenants who come to the village for a home." The Horneys purchased the property in 1900 from James H. Caulk and E.J. Jarman.

This property exists in the 1902 USGS map of Maryland, and appears on the Claiborne Plat of 1912 as "Jackson Store." The three owners which owned this property prior to 1912 suggest that it may have been built in the 1890s as the tourist industry between Claiborne and Ocean City was just beginning to develop.



window on the west side. The second floor of the house is lit by a set of two one-over-one sash windows and one single two-over-two sash window both of which are without shutters.

The west elevation gable end is lit by two two-over-two sash windows with black, louvered shutters on both the first and second floors. One two-over-two sash window lights the attic level which is finished with cornice returns. An exterior, cinderblock chimney sits at this west gable end. The west elevation of the wing which extends to the south from the northeast corner of the house is lit on the second story by two two-over-two sash windows without shutters.

The only outbuilding on the property is a modern, prefabricated storage shed.
