St. Luke's Evangelical Lutheran Church was built in 1889 in the typical form of rural churches in the last quarter of the 19th century, with a rectangular main section and an attached bell tower with the entrance on the gable end. Gothic arches at the window openings and doorway were used by many denominations, as were the open belfry and turret roof with finial. In its original form, St. Luke's had scroll-sawn details on the belfry and a dentil cornice molding. In 1987, a remodeling of the building removed these details and covered with exterior with aluminum siding. A concrete block parish hall had been added to the northeast corner of the church in the late 1950's. St. Luke's was built during a brief period of expansion and building activity in Point of Rocks following the 1870's construction of the Point of Rocks Railroad Station (F-1-129; NR).

St. Luke's Evangelical Lutheran Church is a frame one-story building erected in 1889 on the east side of Ballenger Creek Pike about 100 yards north of the intersection of Clay Street (Md. Rt. 28) in Point of Rocks, Frederick County, Maryland. The church faces west and has a concrete block late 1950's parish hall adjoining it on the northeast corner. Kanawha Avenue, an early 20th century street opened from Ballenger Creek Pike toward the east, borders the north edge of the church property. The date of the church is based on the datestone at the northwest corner of the building's stone foundation and on land records.

The principal section of the church is a rectangular hall with an attached, projecting bell tower on the center of the west gable end with the main entrance in the west side. The windows and door opening have Gothic arches. The exterior is covered with aluminum siding, covering german siding pictured in the original 1978 survey photos. The roof is covered with composition material. The bell tower has an open belfry with a turret roof topped with a weather vane and finial. In the 1978 photos, a scroll-sawn balustrade and dentil molding at the cornice are visible. In 1987, the church was remodeled, according to a stone in the north side of the foundation. At that time, the balustrade, the molding, an arched stained glass window and a rectangular sign panel in the upper west face of the tower were removed or covered over by the aluminum siding. The stained glass panel was relocated to the transom over the double 3-panel doors. The north and south elevations have three bays each, with stained glass windows. On the east gable end, the stone foundation is revealed by the sloping ground level, with a vertical board door into the basement of the church. A projecting section behind the pulpit with arched windows in the north and south sides is centered in the gable end. The interior of the church was inaccessible for this survey.

St. Luke's Evangelical Lutheran Church is a fair example of a typical rural church design found throughout Frederick County in the late 19th century. As stated in the 1978 inventory form, St. Luke's was built during a period of building activity in Point of Rocks following the erection of the Point of Rocks Railroad Station (F-1-129; National Register) in the 1870's. The church has the simple form of many rural churches built in the last quarter of the 19th century, with a gable-roofed hall fronted by a projecting bell tower with the entrance in the base. The open belfry with a turret roof is a familiar sight in both communities and rural areas. The 1987 remodeling removed much of the trim which supported the "carpenter Gothic" stylistic connection mentioned in the 1978 survey.

### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The St. Lukes Evangelical Lutheran Church is a one story frame church three bays wide and three bays deep, which faces east from the west side of Ballenger Creek Pike.

A two story frame belfry extends forward of the main block of the building and accommodates Gothic twin paneled doors with triangular stained glass transom and dentiled molding which states "St. Lukes Evangelical Church, Built 1889." Segmented Gothic stained glass windows are located on the north and south sides of the belfry and occupy each bay of the main block of the residence. The frame belfry tower with original fishscale wood roof, finial, weather vane and bell, has a dentiled frieze at the base of the belfry.

The front gable asphalt roof is jointed to the structure with a plain boxed cornice with return. The entire structure is built on a low whitewashed random stone foundation.

A modern one story cinder block addition has been made on the north side of the main chapel.






