The Job Dix Eichelberger House is an ell shaped two and one-half story quarried grey stone residence which is three bays wide and four bays deep.

The main entrance, a six panel door in a recessed paneled and pilastered entrance with five light transom, and four side lights, is located in the first bay from the southeast corner. Double hung 6/6 windows with large wood lintels occupy the remaining bays on the first and second level.

The interior of the building has a side entrance hall plan, and some woodwork intact including a turned baluster stair rail and deep paneled windowsills.

According to M. J. Grove, History of Carrollton Manor, the great stone house near Lime Kiln was built by Job Dix Eichelberger early in the nineteenth century. It has also been used as a boardinghouse and is typical of the grey stone buildings found in the southern part of Frederick County.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Job Dix Eichelberger House is an ell shaped two and one-half story quarried greystone residence which is three bays wide and four bays deep, set on a hill on the west side of Route 85 near Lime Kiln.

The main entrance, a six panel door in a recessed paneled and pilastered entrance with five light transom, and four side lights, is located in the first bay from the southeast corner. Double hung 6/6 windows with large wood lintels occupy the remaining bays on the first and second level. A modern columned one story porch extends across the front of the residence.

A two story open porch extends along the south part of the two story original stone addition which extends to the rear of the main block.

The interior of the building has a side entrance hall plan, and some woodwork intact including a turned baluster stair rail and deep paneled windowsills.

The entire structure is built on a random stone foundation and is covered by a slate roof. Original brick chimneys straddle the gable on the north and south ends. Two additional chimneys, which have been altered, rise from the rear addition.

The entire property is surrounded by a stone fence. A nineteenth century frame barn and wagon shed are also located on the property.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to M. J. Grove, History of Carrollton Manor, the great stone house near Lime Kiln was built by Job Dix Eichelberger early in the nineteenth century.¹ It has also been used as a boardinghouse and is typical of the greystone buildings found in the southern part of Frederick County.

More recently the structure has been used as a farmhouse and will be restored by a large company who recently purchased the property.


