St. Luke's Protestant Church is a fine brick Gothic church with interesting late nineteenth century detailing including a pierced friezeboard, carved brackets, and leaded glass windows.

The structure is most certainly built from bricks burned at the Thomas brickyards, once located in Buckeystown. The paneled rear door with colored etched glass transom exhibits typical Victorian styling.

The church was built in 1882, during the most active building period in Adamstown, following Jacob Kline's addition to the town in the 1870's.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

St. Luke's Protestant Church is a large one story brick church laid in common bond with a two story belfry which extends from the front of the building.

The main entrance is an arch gothic doorway with diagonal wood twin doors located in the center of the belfry; a triangular segmented glass transom is located over the door. A small dentiled cornice separates the transom and doors. A decorative Header brick arch surrounds the top of the doorway. Located on either side of the belfry are gothic casement windows.

In the center of the belfry on each side is a circular window with a decorative stained glass window. Just below the roofline, in the center of each side of the belfry are gothic louvered vent openings with a decorative brick Header arch similar to that over the main entrance. A pyramidal slate roof with decorative patterning covers the belfry. A small gable extends over the louvered vent on each side of the belfry. A metal cross is located on the top of the building. Brick buttresses are located on the southern corners of the belfry which is four bays long. The single story meeting hall extends to the rear of the belfry.

Occupying each bay are gothic casement windows. A front gable slate roof covers the structure and is attached to the building with a boxed cornice with a small decorative frieze and carved brackets with circular designs.

A small one bay wide frame rear entrance extends from the northwest corner of the building. The entrance, a four panel door is located within a gothic doorway. A triangular transom with an etched glass is located above the door.

The entire building is built on a low random stone foundation, except for the rear entrance foundation which is brick. A cornerstone on the front of the building states "St. Luke's Protestant Episcopal Church 1882". The building is now used for storage and is unfortunately being subjected to vandalism.




