Circa 1824

The Sara Duvall House is an ell shaped two and one-half story coursed random stone residence. The main entrance is an original four panel door with three light transom in recessed paneled entranceway.

The history of Sara Duvall's House is closely related to the small stone commercial building located next door.

The land upon which the house sits was once part of Carrollton Manor, but was sold by Charles Carroll to John Darnall in 1764 and renamed "Good Luck." In 1794, the property was sold to Philip Sinstock, a merchant, and in 1805 George Buckey purchased the land.

The exact construction date of the house and store is not known, however, deed exchanges and selling price indicate that the George Hossellback House, Stone House Pottery, and Sara Duvall House were all built circa 1824.

In 1858, Grafton Duvall purchased both stone buildings and operated a general store. Sara Duvall ran a millinery shop in the house according to local tradition.

Much interior woodworking including the original paneled front door and paneled built-in cupboard remains on the interior of the house.

The exterior of the house exhibits the same fine stonework as the George Hossellback House which was cited by Frank Lloyd Wright in the 1930's.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Sara Duvall House is an ell shaped two and one-half story coursed random stone flank gable roofed residence which faces east from the west side of Route 85 in Buckeystown.

The principal facade is three bays wide. Located in the second bay is a recessed paneled entrance with original four panel door and three light transom. A plain paneled hood decorates the top end sides of the entrance. Occupying the remaining bays on the first and second levels are 2/2 windows with louvered shutters.

The main block of the building is one room deep. A two story frame addition extends to the rear of the residence. The entire building is constructed on a low coursed stone foundation and is covered by a replaced asphalt roof with three stepped brick cornice.

The roof on the addition is connected by a plain boxed cornice. Three single replaced brick chimneys straddle the gables on the north, south, and west sides.


