The St. Marks United Lutheran Church is a one and one-half story painted brick structure laid in common bond. Rising from the center of the front gable is a decorative inset frame bell tower with fishscale shingle work and Gothic openings with quatrefoil decorations. A spire rises from the tower and is topped by a ball finial with weather vane. A semicircular window is located in the center of the front gable at the base of the belfry. Occupying the remaining bays are small narrow Gothic stained glass windows with single header brick arches.

The St. Mark's United Lutheran Church was built in 1882 on a half acre of land donated by Jacob and Rebecca Kline on March 28, 1883.

Jacob Kline was living in Doubs as early as 1873 and donated part of the land adjacent to his property for use by the congregation.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Saint Mark's United Lutheran Church is a one and one-half story painted brick structure laid in common bond which faces west from the east side of Doubs Road in Doubs.

The principle facade is three bays wide. The main entrance, twin two panel doors with a stained glass triangular transom which states "St. Mark's United Lutheran Church" is located in the second bay. The door is located in a small brick entrance which extends forward of the main block of the building.

Rising from the center of the front gable is a decorative inset frame bell tower with fishscale shingle work and Gothic openings with quatrefoil decorations. A spire rises from the tower and is topped by a ball finial with weather vane. A semicircular window is located in the center of the front gable at the base of the belfry. Occupying the remaining bays are small narrow Gothic stained glass windows with single header brick arches.

The main chancel of the church is four bays deep. Large narrow stained glass windows occupy each bay. A two bay wide, one story cinder block addition extends to the rear and north side of the church.

The entire structure is built on a low random limestone foundation. A cornerstone in the northwest corner states "St. Mark's United Lutheran Church, 1882".

The building is covered by a front gable slate roof with fishscale patterning which is connected to the building by a stepped brick cornice with frame return on the front of the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The St. Mark's United Lutheran Church was built in 1882 on a half acre of land donated by Jacob and Rebecca Kline on March 28, 1883.¹

Jacob Kline was living in Doubs as early as 1873 and donated part of the land adjacent to his property for use by the congregation.

According to Grove's History of Carrollton Manor, William Stettlemeyer served as the first pastor of the church.² The Lutheran church is one of two churches located in the community of Doubs.
