Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

The current assessment was prepared on behalf of Duke Energy North America as part of cultural resources investigations to support the proposed construction of a power plant in southern Frederick County near Point of Rocks (Goodwin 2001). This property was surveyed initially in 1982 (Weissman 1982). In 1982, a deteriorated house was noted. During a survey conducted in May 2001, no extant built resources were located in this location. The house was located on property historically owned by Otho Thomas and members of his family. The Otho Thomas land comprised F-1-150, F-1-45, and F-1-151. The property of F-1-150 was acquired by Otho Thomas from his brother Notley Thomas in 1835. The property remained in the ownership of Otho Thomas until his death in 1865. In 1866, 700 acres of Otho Thomas' landholdings comprising F-1-145, F-1-151, and F-1-150 were divided among three of Otho's sons. Charles E. Thomas inherited this portion. By 1873, the land was sold out of the Thomas family to Ezra Michael, who bequeathed the property to his son Harvey Michael in 1886 (RCG&A, Inc., January 2002).

Since no built resources remain extant on this portion of the Vernon-Hines property, there are no buildings that possess the qualities of significance for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. In 2001, the site (18FR785) was the subject of Phase II archeological investigations (RCG&A, Inc. January 2002). The research report contained information on 15 historic cultural features. Artifacts included 1,449 historic artifacts and 1 prehistoric artifact. The report concluded that the historic and prehistoric components did not appear to retain research potential or the qualities of significance applying the National Register Criterion for Evaluation D. The Maryland Historical Trust concurred with this finding in correspondence dated 12 February 2002.



DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The F. Michael House is located at the end of a very long dirt road from the north side of Route 28, northeast of Point of Rocks in southern Frederick County. The house, which is difficult to reach, is located just south of F-1-87, the Henry S. Michael Farm, and is visible from this property (which itself is only accessible from a long dirt drive from Point of Rocks Road). The F. Michael House is two stories high, gable roofed, and of frame construction. The house is vacant and in very deteriorating condition, with window sash and doors missing and some of its framing exposed.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The significance of the F. Michael house is now primarily due to its historical associations with the Michael family who were early settlers in the area, according to Scharf (Vol. I, p. 567). (F-1-87, F-1-138, and F-1-144 are other Michael houses in the vicinity). The house is shown on the 1873 Lake atlas of Frederick County as the F. Michael property. Due to its deteriorated condition, the architectural integrity and significance of the house is diminished, although closer examination of the structure could reveal information concerning its date, type, and plan, as well as method of construction.

This property is probably of local significance, and is not likely to be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.


