The Trinity Lutheran Church is one of two stone churches which remain standing in Knoxville and is probably the oldest congregation of the town.

As indicated by the cornerstones of the building, the original Lutheran Church was constructed in 1848 and rebuilt in its present form in 1873, however no building is sited in the present location on the Bond Map of 1858. The building most certainly was built between 1873 and 1875 since it is not indicated on the Titus Atlas of 1873.

Of particular architectural interest about the building is the very steep grade which the foundation is set upon, the finely paneled twin front entrances and cinquefoil design stained and diamond shaped glass window, front gable and Palladian window.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Trinity Lutheran Church is a front gable one story coursed random stone church building which faces east from the west side of Route 28 in Knoxville. Although not connected, it is built in close proximity to the frame Sunday School building located just south of the church.

The principal facade is two bays wide. Main entrance doors occupy each bay and are inset into deep recessed side and overhead paneled doorways with white outstone doorsills. Each door is an original four panel door with dentiled cornice, replaced hardware and one light transom with a stained glass window in floral design. White cut stone lintels are located over each doorway.

Located over the entrance centered in the front gable is a Palladian window with stained glass separated into three sets of tall narrow windows. The window is bordered at the top by a brick arch.

The main block is three bays deep with ornate single pane stained glass windows in diamond patterning with cinquefoil decoration at the base and medallion depicting a variety of scenes at the top of each window.

Extending to the rear of the main building in the center of the west gable end is an original small coursed random stone transept with shed roof. No windows are located on the west side of the transept, but small stained glass 1/1 windows with solid orange colored stone lintels located over each window are centered in the narrow north and south sides of the transept. No other windows, doors or ornamentation are located on the west gable end of the building. The rear of the building which backs up to the B & O Railroad line is steeply banked.

The entire building which is built on a course random stone foundation matching the wall fabric is covered by a front gable replaced tin roof with boxed cornice and diagonally dentiled frieze.

A frame belfry straddles the front gable. A pyramidal replaced tin roof with turned wood finial is supported by four chamfered wood columns with simple brackets enclosing a swinging cast iron bell.

Two cornerstones are located in the foundation of the building; in the southeast corner is the date "1848" and in the northeast corner "Rebuilt 1873."

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Trinity Lutheran Church is one of two stone churches which remain standing in Knoxville and is probably the oldest congregation of the town.

As indicated by the cornerstones of the building, the original Lutheran Church was constructed in 1848 and rebuilt in its present form in 1873, however no building is sited in the present location on the Bond Map of 1858.

In April 1875, Warren and Ann P. Garrott sold "the Mill Lot" on which the church now sits for \$100.00 to the church council made up of Philip Porter, Charles W. Fry, J. Rice Garrott and J. M. Miller.¹

The building most certainly was built between 1873 and 1875 since it is not indicated on the Titus Atlas of 1873.

Of particular architectural interest about the building is the very steep grade which the foundation is set upon, the finely paneled twin front entrances and cinquefoil design stained and diamond shaped glass window, front gable and Palladian window.




