The Mount Prospect Methodist Episcopal Church is a significant building in the growth and history of the methodist congregation in the Lewistown area of Frederick County. The small brick chapel with ornate frame belfrey dominates the landscape and has become a local landmark in this region.

According to a history of the church it was built in its present location because "this was the first location, coming south, that could have been used (along the main road from Frederick Town to Brien's Furnace) as all the land for about five miles to the north belonged to the Great Land Company operating the Catoctin Furnace."

The existing building was originally built in 1833 and rebuilt in 1883. A first hand account of the original building seen in 1876 and related in the 100th Anniversary Program of the Church describes the church as "a plain red brick building, two stories high with a gallery on three sides and a low partition down the middle of the building, separating the sisters from the brethren as the different sexes used separate doors."

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (con't)

Mount Prospect Methodist Episcopal Church

In 1847 the church split into Methodist Protestant and Methodist Episcopal factions. The Methodist Protestant congregation left the church building the Methodist Church in Lewistown which is still standing. In 1883 under the direction of Joe Greer the building was renovated, the balconies on two sides were removed, Gothic windows were added; the building was extended in the front to accommodate a new entrance, an oil chandelier was purchased and the center partition was removed.⁵

In 1884 a cast steeple bell was obtained from Henry McGran and Company of Baltimore. It remains intact. On June 7, 1890 the Mount Prospect Methodist Episcopal Church became an incorporated body.

In 1904 and 1919 additional land for the cemetery was added.⁶ Threatened by demolition in the 1960's when the methodist congregation moved out, the building was acquired by the Lewistown Cemetery Association which has carefully preserved the building both on the interior and exterior in its 1883 architectural style.



DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

THIS 1 1/2 STORY BRICK CHURCH DATES FROM THE 1883 REBUILDING OF AN EARLIER (1833) CHURCH. IT IS LAID IN COMMON BOND, HAS A WOODEN BELFRY/TOWER ON THE NORTH END AND 1 BRICK CHIMNEY ON THE SOUTH END. THE FOUNDATION IS OF STONE. THERE IS AN ELABORATE BRACKETTED AND DENTILATED CORNICE.

THE FIRST STAGE OF THE TOWER (BELOW THE BELFRY) HAS THREE APPLIED WOODEN ARCHES AND A MODILLION BLOCK CORNICE. THE BELFRY ROOF



HAS A BRACKETTED & DENTILATED CORNICE MORE ELABORATE THAN THE MAIN BODY OF THE CHURCH. ALL WINDOWS ARE LANCET-TYPE WITH BLINDS. A CAST IRON FENCE RUNS ALONG THE ROAD AND MARKS THE FRONT BOUNDARY OF THE CEMETARY WHICH SURROUNDS THE CHURCH.

THE NORTH (MAIN) FACADE IS THREE BAYS WIDE WITH A DOUBLE DOOR IN THE CENTER WITH A POINTED ARCH TRANSOM. A PLAQUE ABOVE THE DOOR READS:

" MT. PROSPECT M. E. CHURCH "

THERE IS A POINTED-ARCH WINDOW IN THE GABLE, A DATESTONE ON THE NORTHWEST CORNER READS:

" 1833
REBUILT 1883 "

THE EAST & WEST FACADES ARE EACH 4 BAYS DEEP THERE ARE NO OPENINGS AND 1 EXTERIOR CHIMNEY ON THE SOUTH FACADE.

ON THE INTERIOR THE CHURCH RETAINS ITS "SLAVE BALCONY"

THE PROXIMITY OF THE TWO BUILDINGS AND THEIR SIMILARITY OF DETAIL, PLUS THE SITE OF BOTH ON TOP OF A SMALL HILL CREATES AN IMPRESSIVE ATMOSPHERE OF VICTORIAN RURAL AMERICA.



DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Mount Prospect Methodist Episcopal Church is a front gable one story brick chapel with frame belfry laid in common bond which faces north from the south side of Angleberger Road.

The principal facade is three bays wide. The main entrance, twin three panel doors with triangular segmented transom and quarried stone doorstep is located in the center bay.

Flanking the door are Gothic double hung 4/4 windows with double header arches and louvered shutters. A painted two pane triangular window with header arches is located in the center of the front gable.

A small marble plaque above the door indicates "Mt. Prospect M. E. Church." The chancel is four bays deep with double hung Gothic 6/4 windows with double header arches and louvered shutters occupying each bay on the east and west sides of the building. There are no windows on the south side of the building. A single brick exterior chimney rises up the center of the south side of the building. The entire building is built on a low whitewashed random stone foundation and is covered by a standing seam tin roof with cast iron snow stops.

The roof is supported by a plain boxed cornice with architrave molding and return. A dentiled frieze with paired scrolled brackets are located beneath the eaves on the north, east and west sides. A square frame belfry with pyramidal patterned tin roof straddles the front gable.

The roof is supported by four scrolled brackets with dentiled frieze and boxed cornice on each side and set on four boxed columns. A sawnwork railing between the columns encloses the original bell.

The entire belfry is set on a frame box-like support covered with German siding.

The church is surrounded by a decorative cast iron fence with the letters "In Memory of Our Dead" on the gates to the cemetery.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Mt. Prospect Methodist Episcopal Church is a significant building in the growth and history of the methodist congregation in the Lewistown area of Frederick County. The small brick chapel with ornate frame belfry dominates the landscape and has become a local landmark in this region.

The land upon which the church was originally built known as "Peters Increase" was purchased by the trustees February 4, 1833 from Peter and Parmenia Sewers.¹

According to a history of the church it was built in its present location because "this was the first location, coming south, that could have been used (along the main road from Frederick Town to Brien's Furnace) as all the land for about five miles to the north belonged to the Great Land Company operating the Catoctin Furnace."²

The existing building was originally built in 1833 and rebuilt in 1883. A first hand account of the original building seen in 1876 and related in the 100th Anniversary Program of the Church describes the church as "a plain red brick building, two stories high with a gallery on three sides and a low partition down the middle of the building, separating the sisters from the brethren as the different sexes used separate doors."³

According to the deed Somerset R. Waters, John Coe, Frederick Cronise, Samuel C. Weeks and John Devilbiss were the original trustees of the church and pledged to "erect or build or cause to be erected or builded thereon a house or place of worship for the use of the members of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the U.S.A." Two builders of the church were Simon Weller of Thurmont, and Henry Bowersox of Utica Mills.⁴
