The Stoner Miller's House is the miller's house of the Stoner Mill, which was located nearby on the Linganore Creek. It is a one and half story banked rubble stone building with large exterior hipped stone chimney which dominates the north side of the building.

Numerous interior and exterior changes including a one story cinder block addition on the south side has considerably changed the character of the building.

Little is known about the operation of this mill, but it was one of at least ten mills once located on the creek, none of which are in existence any longer. They were the Linganore Mill built by Charles Hammond in 1810; Boyer's Mill operated by the Boyer's until 1880; Cragg Mill originally built around 1740; stones of the mill were used to repair Gas House Pike when it was torn down; Jone's Mill operated by John Jones until 1872; Avignon Mill originally Hell's Mill located near Old Annapolis Road; Glisan's Mill operated by the Glisan family until well into the twentieth century; Dorsey Mill located in New London, Gipson Mill once near Central Church and Shriner's Mill near Unionville.¹

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Stoner Millers House is a one and one-half story banked rubble stone building constructed in two parts which faces east at the end of Plantation Lane.

Each section is two bays wide and one room deep. A modern one story cinder block addition, which replaced a frame addition in the 1950's, is located on the south end of the building.

The main entrance, a replaced modern door, is located in the second bay of the center section of the building. A replaced double hung 6/6 window occupies the other bay.

The northern most section of the building is smaller than the center section and is set back further than the main block. A large exterior hipped chimney dominates this section of the building on the north side.

Each section is covered by a flank gable replaced wood shingle roof which extends forward of the main block to accommodate a one story open frame porch located across the front of the building.

A pedimented dormer window is located in the center of the roof of each section. A replaced brick chimney straddles the south gable of the south section of the building. Very little of the original interior fabric remains in the house.

A barn and log outbuilding once located on the premises were torn down in the 1950's according to the owner.


