The Mount Carmel United Methodist Church is a one and a half story coursed stone house of worship with stepped brick cornice and slate roof, which was built along the Old National Road in 1854.

According to church records, stone for the building was hauled from a nearby ridge by Benny Duvall and the painting was done by Amos Esworthy, both church members.

Originally the church had wooden steps leading to the front entrance. The church was part of a circuit with methodist protestant churches in Kemptown and New Market.

A small graveyard east of the church building, holds the graves of several infantrymen who participated in the Battle of the Monocacy, July 9, 1864.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Mt. Carmel Church is a one-and-a-half story gable roofed coursed stone structure which faces north from the south side of U.S. 40 or the Old National Road.

The building is two bays wide and three bays long. The two entrance doors have been replaced but the original three light transom and wooden lintel are still in place over the entrances. An elliptical window with radiating brick voussoir arch is located in the north gable. Below this window is a hand lettered plaque which states "Mount Carmel Meth. Prot. Church 1854". Three double hung 6/6 windows with wood lintels are located on the east and west sides of the building. The slate roof is finished by a stepped brick cornice on the east and west sides and a boxed cornice with return on the north side.

Two small brick chimneys straddle the gables on the north and south side.

A modern cinderblock addition is located south of the building.

A cemetery is located immediately east of the church building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The first mission meetings of the Mt. Carmel Methodist congregation were held in the Hammond School building which is no longer standing.

On March 1, 1855, the land for a church was purchased from William and Lucinda Reich. Construction of the building must have begun before the deed was registered since the cornerstone was laid in 1854. According to church records stone for the building was hauled from a nearby ridge by Benny Duvall and the painting was done by Amos Esworthy, both church members.

The church was part of a circuit with Kemptown and New Market. The first minister of the church was N. Dorsey who received \$20 a month for his services.

Originally the church had wooden steps lending to the front entrance. Remodeling of the church was done in 1962.

Several infantrymen who participated in the Battle of the Monocacy on July 9, 1864, are buried in the church cemetery.

According to the weekly Frederick newspaper, The Examiner, the church was dedicated Sunday December 24, 1854, with Reverend Josiah Varden and John W. Everist officiating.¹


WALKERSVILLE
