### 7.1 Description:

Mt. Zion Lutheran Church is a brick church built in 1905 on the site of an earlier church building on the southeast corner of Haugh's Church Road and Nicholson Road about 2 miles northwest of Maryland Route 194 near Woodsboro, Maryland. Built on an irregular plan with intersecting gables, the church is a Romanesque Revival hall type with a belfry tower in the intersecting angle of the gable sections. The stretcher bond exterior walls are on a stone foundation. The principal windows are an arched, traceried stained glass window in the west gable end which has brownstone trim, and arched stained glass windows in the north gable section. The entrances are in the base of the belfry tower. Each has double 6-panel doors and projecting brick trim on the round arches above the stained glass transoms. The shaft of the tower has 4 vertical recesses in the north and west elevations. The belfry is open with screens protecting the bells, and a slate pyramidal roof tops the tower, ending in a cross finial. The main roof of the church is patterned slate.

A two-story brick education wing was built connecting with the east elevation in the 1950's.

Located across Haugh's Church Road to the north is a cemetery which dates from the late 18th century and was first associated with Haugh's Church, a German Reformed Church no longer extant. The Mt. Zion Church continues to use the cemetery.


### 8.1 Significance

Mt. Zion Lutheran Church is a good example of small rural churches of the early 20th century in Frederick County. It represents the replacement of older religious buildings by long-established congregations. Mt. Zion was founded in 1853 and the present church was built in 1905. Architecturally, it is a good, little altered illustration of the Romanesque Revival style which was popular at the beginning of the 20th century. Its simplified forms reflect the rural location.


Mt. Zion is one of many rural churches built in the last quarter of the 19th and first quarter of the 20th century. Its strength is its well-preserved exterior. The interior was not reviewed in this survey and a full description should be made to complete a context discussion for the church.
