DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story building containing a restaurant and barber shop on the first floor and offices on the second. The front facade on N. Market Street is four bays wide and three bays deep with a steeply pitched "A" frame metal roof and a chimney placed back from the north gable and along the ridge. The five bay long wing covers the full width of the front section and is a shorter 2-1/2 story structure. It also has a steep metal "A" frame roof. The building is exposed on three sides with the two street facades being stuccoed and the rear in common bond brick. The first floor of the front side is composed of large plat glass windows and the barber shop on the side street has the same. The rear contains 2/1 sash windows with flat brick header arches and wood lintels and sills. The second floor front and side windows are 1/1 and 2/1 with stucco covering the window framing. There are two dormer windows on the front facade with round arched 2/2 sash and topped by gables with returns and decorated by rows of dentils and fluted pilasters. The north gable forms a pediment with protruding moulded cornices fronting the triangle.

There is a water table at the base of the north wall. The building has had a stuccoed finish for many years and is but said to be of stone by a local architect, C. F. Bowers.
