DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story building clearly divided in half so as to almost appear as two buildings. It is faced with red brick laid in common running bond. The primary structural material is also brick but of rougher workmanship. The trim is wood painted yellow. A flat roof covers the building.

On the facade's left half at the first floor is the entrance to the apartments. This is a recessed doorway under a brick Roman arch. In front of the arched opening is a set of concrete steps with iron railings. To the right of this opening, but still in the building's left half, is a double hung window with 2/2 sash - the top is fixed. This has a stone sill and a brick Roman arch over it. Both arches have brick keystones. Below this window is a cellar window and in front of that steps to the basement.

In the first story's right half is a metal and glass storefront consisting of a door with transom between two display windows; there are panels over all three parts. On each side of the storefront are Ionic pilasters with no bases. These carry an entablature above the store; the frieze has a panel ornament and the cornice console modillions.

At the second and third floors, each half of the building has three bays. The second floor windows are double hung with 1/1 sash. They have stone sills and jack arch lintels with brick keystones. At their sill line and above their lintels two raised courses of brick extend across the front. The third story windows are similar except their sills are wood and the jack arches over them have no keystones.

Above the third story window heads is the building's entablature composed of a wood architrave with dentils, a brick frieze, and a wood cornice with saw-tooth dentils, tablet flower ornaments, and perforations in the form of Greek crosses.

The building's north wall is thickened up to the third floor level and is strengthened by stepped brick buttresses.
