**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a large three story combination of two buildings of brick and detached on the right side. It is eight narrow bays wide and approximately five bays in depth with an "L" shaped wing approximately six bays square, an added extension of five bays and another of three bays--both approximately three bays wide. All brickwork is in common bond and there are star brace terminals in the right wall. The first floor front has a deeply recessed central entrance of double glass doors with side show windows of small pane casements. On either side are paneled pilasters and large pane show windows on a granite base with a high transom of small leaded panes over all. This is capped by a moulded cornice. All upper story front windows are of round arched 1/1 sash with three row header arches with hood molds and a three row brick belt course crosses between the windows. Most wing windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The roof of the front section slopes to the rear, and the wings have metal shed roofs. The front cornice line is very simple with a massive moulded cornice on a raised wood paneled frieze and supported by Victorian "V" shaped large moulded brackets. This building sets on a low foundation and is fronted by an old brick pavement still showing the division line of the two properties.


