DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a detached 2-1/2 story brick building, three large bays wide and four bays in depth. A wider, five bay section two bays in depth, extends across the rear of the structure in a "T" shape. The end bays of this section are fronted by a flat parapet extending out from the eaves of the roofline. A two bay square addition extends to the rear of the southwest corner and has a flat roof with 1/1 sash windows.

The building has a rather steep "A" frame metal roof extending back over the rear section. No chimneys are visible. The front and sides of the building are faced with stucco and the rear wall is of common bond brick. The front facade is of the Romanesque style. Doorways occupy the end bays and contain double paneled doors with Doric pilasters and round arched fan windows above with an intricate rope design motif. In the first floor center bay is a palladian window with mullions and narrow Doric pillars tied together at the top by flat entablatures with tiny dentils. The whole window is topped by a half round wooden arch containing the rope design over the doorways. These doors and the window are slightly recessed in an arcade design. The second floor front is framed in three recessed sections divided by Doric pilasters. Across the bottom is an indented belt course and a protruding cornice at the top. Round arched, multi-paned windows occupy the end bays and the one below. The front gable contains a recessed fan window of the same design as over the doors. All side and rear windows are of 2/2 sash and those on the rear wall have flat brick arches. A fan window occupies the rear gable wall. Second floor side windows have wood sills and those on the first floor are of brick. A box cornice with finely incised modillions runs along the three sections of the front gable-pediment, side roofline and across the top of the side parapets. The building sets on a low foundation. A herringbone pattern brick pavement fronts the building with small landscaped and hedged gardens on either side.

A wooden plaque gives the date 1813, name of the building, and that it was used as a church until 1855 when the nearby All Saints church was dedicated.
