2. Description of physical appearance prior to rehabilitation:
Eleven East Second Street is a two and one-half story ell shaped gable roofed brick townhouse laid in common bond, three bays wide and five bays deep. A two story open porch extends along the addition to the rear of the building on the east side. A small one and one-half story brick building which pre-dates the main residence is also attached to the rear of the house.

3. Statement of significance:
This large two and one-half story brick of Federal design is typical of Frederick architecture of that period and is a vital contributing factor to the rhythm of the streetscape.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a large brick, 2-1/2 story house detached on the right side. It is three large bays square with an "L" shaped brick, two story wing, 1-1/2 bays wide and five bays long attached to another section of the same width and three bays long which the owner claims is older, but debatable because of later style architecture. There is a long side balcony. Attached to the rear is a very old 1-1/2 story brick building at a right angle which is three bays wide and two bays in depth (see significance*). All brickwork is of common bond with the rear section a very soft salmon brick and the front facade recently restored. The front entranceway occupies the left bay with a pair of old paneled doors of a very light wood and recently restored with round arched top panels. This is topped by a segmental arched transom with a moulded transom bar. The arch is of protruding shaped voussoirs forming a drip mould with long brick "keystones" as above all front windows. The doorway is entered by a low-walled granite stoop. All front windows are of 2/2 sash and segmentally arched. There is a 2/2 JIB window-door on the rear of the front section with shutters of louvers over panels. The wing has 6/6 sash windows with flat brick arches and louvered shutters. The second section has 2/2 sash windows with segmental two row header arches and louvered shutters. Rear doors have paneled enframements, are of four panels, and have three pane overlights. The rear building has wide 6/6 heavy moulded frames and old three paneled shutters. On the front is a pair of old paneled doors. The expo. right side eave is decorated by a scalloped barge board . There is a small chimney at the rear end. The front section has a steep slope "A" frame roof of slate with a three string brick cornice on the front and a small enclosed chimney on the right wall. The attic is lighted by two six pane windows on the right side. The wings have shed roofs and the end building has a moderate slope "A" frame roof. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation and is fronted by a brick pavement laid in a herringbone pattern. There is a brick dooryard patio and a long rear lawn area.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This is a very attractive old Federal home in excellent condition and especially attractive since the front facade has been restored. It adds much to the streetscape of Second Street and to downtown Frederick.

*This very old appearing brick building was probably built as a small shop because of its double doors. Mr. John Motter, the owner, claims that word has been passed through the later generations that this building was used by Michael Cresap to store ammunition and serve as an armory to train local volunteers for the Revolutionary Company that he later marched to Boston during the war.




