**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a tall, 2-1/2 story Federal home of brick, detached on the right side. It is three wide bays in width and two bays in depth with a two story brick "L" shaped wing, six narrow bays in depth and two bays wide with a long side balcony and a two story brick, one bay wide side extension which continues back from the right rear corner of the front section for a total length of eight bays. This is known as #18A with a separate front entrance. Front brickwork is laid in painted Flemish bond, and all other is in common bond. The main entranceway occupies the center bay and is of an attractive, three part Federal design with a wide, six panel door with sidelights over panels divided by Doric pillars and with a paneled enframing. Above is a six pane overlight with a brick segmental arch decorated in the infill by a carved roundel and pointed panels. This doorway has a marble sill and is approached by a high brownstone porch of seven steps with a brownstone support pier. There is an attractive Federal style wrought iron railing in an oval and circle design. The two first floor front windows are tall, double 12/12 sash with fluted mullions, hinged double shutters of panels, and with segmental (brick) arches and trim as over the doorway. On the right sidewall is a large single window similar in design and with 16/16 sash. All front second story windows are of 1/1 sash with wood lintels and sills and paneled shutters. These shutters are secured by old style "S" fasteners. Rear area windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. There are louvered shutters on the second story and paneled shutters on the first floor with board and batten shutters on the last bays of the side extension--the dependency. There are four and six panel doors with three and four pane overlights and board and batten doors on the extension. This dependency served two functions. One side was a smokehouse with the racks still in place, and the other side was a toilet. The attic is well lighted by a 6/6 stepped dormer window on the rear and 4/2 sash windows in the right gable. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof resting on three string brick cornices on the front and rear. Wide enclosed chimneys rise from each gable. This roof is enclosed by side-wall roof curtains and ended by buttresses. The wing roof is rather flat and both are of metal with the front section having a wood, shake-shingle base. This house rests on a high English basement faced with brick and with large square front windows giving this the appearance of a three story house. Interior features include random width flooring, old hardware, evidence of six fireplaces, hand split lathes, pegged ridge boards, and the name "J H Haur 1887" scribb ed in an attic timber.
