DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#125 is a three story brick attached house approximately three bays square with a three story brick "T" shaped wing shared with #127. It is five bays deep and two bays wide with side galleries and a 2-1/2 story dependency extension shared with #127. All brickwork is in common bond. The simple front entranceway occupies the left (W) bay with a low, four panel door with the top section now in glass and with a paneled enframingent. The first floor area is fronted by a low covered porch with turned pillars and square banisters. It is topped by second story porch flooring and wire mesh railing. This second story porch is reached by a 6/6 sash JIB window-door (only one in Frederick located on the front) with long louvered shutters located in the center bay. All other front windows are of 6/6 sash with louvered shutters with those on the first floor being shorter. All, including the doorway, are topped by wood lintels and with wood sills. Upper story lintels have top moulding with end blocks. Rear windows are of small 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and paneled or louvered shutters. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wing shares a low slope "A" frame roof with #127. The front roofline is decorated by a protruding moulded cornice supported by closely spaced cut brackets with turned pendant trim as on #127 and #129. This house rests on a low foundation. The front is paved by a herringbone patterned brick pavement.
