DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This building was formerly a Y.M.C.A. and has been converted to offices. It is detached, three stories in height, rests on a high basement, is of a rectangular "H" shape with a formal design of two, seven by three bay end sections connected by a seven bay long recessed center section which is five bays in depth. End sections have hipped roofs while the center section is a steep sloped "A" frame, all covered with slate shingles. The former tall chimneys and seven round arched dormer windows have been removed from the roof. The north and west street facades are faced with a thin white brick while the other sides are of regular brick, all in common bond. The main entrance is on Church Street in the center bay. This is framed by sandstone quoins, is recessed, and contains double glass paneled doors with an overlight. It is reached by a sandstone porch with Doric pillars supporting a porch roof in the shape of a Greek Revival entablature and supported at the wall by fluted brackets. A balustrade formerly enclosed this roof. The window above this entrance is topped by a large protruding pediment with a plain architrave and supported by scrolled brackets on either side. The west entrance in the north end of the recessed section was formerly similar to the main entrance, but the entablature and ballustrade were supported by the brackets with no pillars. This has been altered to a modern enclosed entranceway.

All windows have 1/1 sash with sandstone lintels and sills for the street facade, and three course header segmental arches with wood sills for the other sides. Both street facades are ornamented with masonry designs. The base of the building is faced with rock faced rectangular blocks of red sandstone topped by a watercourse of long sandstone blocks at the first floor level. Thirteen belt courses of six bricks line the wall from the watercourse to the second floor level and are topped by a protruding sandstone cornice with two rows of brick dentils beneath. Second floor windows are located in recesses with round arched tops and diamond shaped designs of brick are centered in the infill. Brick quoins frame the corners of the building above the first floor level. There is a protruding box cornice all around the roofline with a decorative band of the egg and dart motif. Just below this is a three string brick cornice section with the center row being vertical brick headers, one brick apart. At each corner of the building are pairs of flat moulded drops in the cornice.
