## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ralph W. Hinebaugh House is located just below MD Route 42, NW of Blooming Rose Church. The ground slopes from NE to SW, making the foundation more visible toward the SW. Tall weeds grow close to the rear (NW) of the house.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed, ell-plan dwelling with a symmetrical, three-bay facade. The facade points SE. The main block measures two bays on the sides, and the ell measures two bays long by one bay wide.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation, originally painted white. The walls are covered with molded-bevel novelty siding, and both wire and cut nails are used in the house's construction. The house has double-beaded cornerboards. The siding was originally painted white with red trim, but has now badly weathered.

The windows are two over two sash, with cornices and symmetrically moulded trim. The configuration of the trim is a cavetto with an ovolo on either side. The attic windows in the NE, NW, and SW gable ends are single-paned diamonds, with bullseye corner blocks and symmetrically moulded trim. The facade door has four panels and a single-paned transom and is covered with a new screen door. The ell has two doors, one on the NE elevation and one on the SW elevation. On the NE elevation a wooden cellar door is visible at the center of the foundation. On the NW elevation, the windows are offset to the North.

The roof is covered with standing seam metal. The house has one interior stove chimney in the ell just NW of the main block.

The house has two porches. A one-story hipped-roof porch fills in the ell on the NE elevation. It is supported by three turned posts. On the SW elevation, a one-story, hipped-roof porch runs the length of the ell. This porch is supported by four turned posts. Both porches exhibit jigsaw brackets and jigsaw balustrades.

The interior appears to consist of a central, enclosed staircase with a single room on either side.

The house is currently unoccupied but does not appear to be abandoned. This is evidenced by the new screen door on the facade door and the neatly trimmed lawn at the front and NE elevations.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The formality of design and the relatively elaborate detail of this house indicates that it was constructed for a well-to-do Garrett County citizen. The porch brackets, similar to those seen in Selbysport and elsewhere, as well as the symmetrically moulded trim and cornerblocks and other details, indicate that someone of means and taste was involved in the house's construction.
