DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two-story frame house stands on the side of a gently sloping hill. The L-shaped structure faces south. The three-bay main block is followed by a two-bay ell to the rear. Porches appear on either side of the kitchen and across the facade. A low entrance is located at the cellar's exposed north end.

A central cut-stone chimney heats the house. The facade features a central entrance. The door, composed of two sets of three narrow panels, is topped by a two-pane transom. 2/2 windows topped by pedimented architraves light the house.

A standing-seam metal roof covers the building. Lapped weatherboards applied with cut nails sheath the walls. Pointed shingles decorate the gables. The house stands on a foundation of rough stone blocks.

The entrance opens into the larger of the main block's two rooms. the smaller west room includes a built-in cupboard alongside the chimney in its northeast corner.

A vertical-plank garage and a collapsed bank barn are located east of the house. A stone milk house stands to the west.
