DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story, five bay dwelling includes a rear ell and a two-story southern bay window. Proches shelter the easter facade, and either side of the ell. 2/2 windows capped by pedimented window heads light the aluminum-sided building. The house stands on a cut stone block foundation, and its gable roof is covered with sheet metal. A central brick chimney heats the house.

The floor plan comprises two rooms. An open stair turns in the southwest corner of the south room. The many decorative elements of the stair include a large octagonal newel post, turned balusters, and jigsaw step ends.

A cellar entered from the north underpins the structure. The building's construction is said to include 3" x 5" studs and half-log joists.


