DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Lucinda Kolbfleisch Log House is located on Cove Road, about .2 mile from its intersection with Pig's Ear Road. The house sits back from the road and between it and the road is a mobile home. Behind the house is a field which runs north to low hills.

The House is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling of V-notched log construction. The facade points south and is obscured by trees. The house measures 20' by 30'.

The house rests on a low cut stone foundation. The logs are chinked with diagonal boards and daubed with cement and the house was at one time covered with german siding; this siding still partly covers all elevations. The windows are one over one sash. The roof is boards which were covered at one time with tarpaper.

A frame summer kitchen was attached at one time to the east gable end, but has long since disappeared. A hole has been cut in the north wall, possibly to more easily accommodate storage. The interior displays a central staircase with a room on either side. Unfortunately the house is in extremely poor condition and seems in imminent danger of collapse.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The owners speculate that this house was built in the 19th century but are unable to be more precise. It is an example, along with the Edward Hachman House (g-II-B-066) across the road, of the early construction types used in Garrett County in the 19th century. Cove Road was once part of the Old Morgantown Road, a major east-west road in the 19th century, a fact which may argue for an early date for the house. This house was last occupied in 1964, by Lucinda Kolbfleisch and her son Ralph, the current owner.


