DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is situated in a hilly area on Zehner Road approximately one mile north of Rt. 40. The house faces west. It is two story, three bay by two bay structure with a gable roof. A wooden porch supported by large slightly tapered square posts covers the first story facade, with a one bay by one bay addition at the south end of the porch. A wooden porch with chamfered posts with jigsaw balustrades extends the length of the rear, east, elevation. The central four panel entrance has a transom as does the central rear entrance with a glass panel top door.

An interior brick gable end chimney is located at the north elevation and an exterior one is located at the south elevation. 2/2 sash windows light the first story of the house, with 1/1 sash windows in the second story. Plain surrounds with pedimented window heads frame the windows. Small 1/1 sash windows are located in the gable ends. The cellar is entered at ground level beneath the rear porch.

The house rests on a cut stone block foundation. German siding covers the exterior, with corrugated metal on the roof.

 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a common Western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block, were constructed in Garrett County from the late 19th through the early 20th centuries.

The house was built sometime between 1885-1890 by William Tressler at the cost of \$6.00/thousand planks. In 1905 Christian "Bud" Beachy, the father of the present owner, Clyde, bought the house.


