DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Newton Savage House is located a few feet from White Rock Road, approximately a mile SE of Keeler Glade. The area consists of fields and woods over rolling hills.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed, ell-plan dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points E. Pine trees press in on the S elevation of the house.

The house rests on a low coursed stone foundation and is covered on the E and N elevations with moulded-bevel novelty siding. The walls are constructed of vertical planks. The S elevation is covered with brick-patterned asphalt siding and the W elevation is covered with German siding. The N and W elevations of the ell are covered partly with German siding and partly with vertical boards. Three windows on the facade (E elevation) have been blocked: two with German siding and one with sheet metal. One window on the W elevation of the main block has lost its sash. All other windows are two over two sash with simple cornices. The surrounds are moulded in a symmetrical astragal and ogee pattern.

The roof is covered with standing seam metal. The house has two interior chimneys: one of glazed yellow brick to the N of center in the main block, and one of plain brick at the gable end of the ell.

On the facade the outline of a one-story, hipped- roof porch is visible; however, no other traces of the porch remain. The interior of the house is unknown and the entire structure is deteriorated.

South of the house is a small, one-story, gable-roofed building; now unused. It is identified by the owners as a store. Its facade points N.

The store rests on cinderblock and brick piers and all elevations except the facade are covered with unpainted weatherboards. The facade is covered with white German siding and has a central door with a window on either side. These windows are blocked, but a window on the S elevation has two over one sash. All windows have simple cornices and plain board surrounds.

The entrance is shaded by a shed-roofed hood. The roof and hood roof are covered with asphalt shingles. Immediately to the W of the store is a vintage Shell gasoline pump.

Southwest of the store is a frame bank barn, resting on a low stone foundation. The walls are covered with vertical boards and the roof with standing seam metal.

West of the store is the farmhouse currently in use on the property. It is constructed entirely of concrete block.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen wing, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.

The store is in better condition than the house but has not been used in some time.

Newton Savage built this house with lumber from the nearby Kendall sawmill in about 1900.


