DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is situated in a hilly area east of Elder Hill on Friendsville-Hoyes Road approximately 7/8 miles from that roads intersection with Bishoff Road. The house faces south. It is a two story, three bay by one bay gable roof structure with a two bay by one bay ell. A single story shed addition slopes off the north elevation of the ell. A porch, supported by turned and knobbed wooden posts runs across the east elevation. The house can be entered from the center facade entrance or from the rear north elevation entrance covered with a bracketed overhang.

The house has a central brick chimney. One over one sash windows light the house with the excepts of a large picture window on the first story facade and a row of three, three over one windows on the first story rear (north) elevation. Small, single pane windows appear in the gables. The windows are framed with flatboards. The house rests on a cut stone foundation. Beaded German siding covers the house with diamond-shaped shingles in the gables of the main structure. The roof is covered with corrugated metal sheeting.


