DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Grace Brethren Church is located on the E side of Bumblebee Road about a half mile SE of Spear Road. The church sits right on the road and has a parking lot to the SE.

The church is a rectangular, gable-roofed building which is divided into three sections: one-story vestibule to the SW, one-story sanctuary at the center, and two-story parish hall to the NE. The vestibule has a double-doored entrance on its SE elevation.

The church rests on a coursed stone foundation and is covered with aluminum siding. The vestibule and parish hall contain paired eight-light casement windows, while the sanctuary section contains sash lancet windows. The roof is covered with corrugated metal and the church has one interior brick stove chimney on the SE elevation. The interior arrangement of the church is unknown.
