DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Glenn Keller House is located at the end of Keller Road, which runs west from Rt. 219S, about 2 miles south of Accident. The house is surrounded by trees.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling with a gable-end facade. The facade points east and is covered with a one-story, gable-roofed, enclosed porch. A one-story, shed-roofed addition is attached to the north elevation.

The house rests on a stone foundation and is covered with aluminum siding. The windows are 2/2 sash. The roof is covered with corrugated metal. The house has two exterior brick stove chimneys: one on the west gable end and one on the north elevation of the shed-roofed addition. The interior arrangement is unknown.

Southwest of the house is a gable-roofed, frame bank barn, which, according to the owner, was moved to this house from G-II-B-220, the Frazee-Margraff House.


