DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is situated on an embankment in a hilly, semi-wooded area on Rt. 495.

The house faces north. It is a two story, three-bay by two-bay gable roof structure with a one-bay by two-bay ell. A single story gable roof addition is located at the west elevation.

A wooden porch, supported by chamfered posts, extends across the facade and the east elevation of the main block and the south elevation of the ell. A single story shed addition runs along the south elevation of the main block and the west elevation of the ell to the porch.

The house is entered from the central facade entrance and at the south elevation of the west shed addition.

The house has a central brick chimney. 2/2 sash windows light the house, with two pane windows in the gable ends.

The cellar is entered from the west elevation of the ell at ground level.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation. Hexagonal asphalt shingles cover the house, with plain asphalt shingles on the roof.


