**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Tom Moon Farm is located on the E side of Boiling Spring Road, about a mile SE of Bethlehem Road. The farm sits well E of the road and is not visible from the road. The farm consists of a house, a barn, several outbuildings, and a small graveyard.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points E and is covered by a one-story, shed-roofed porch. A one-story shed-roofed porch covers the W end of the N elevation and the N third of the W elevation. A one-story three-sided bay is attached to the S elevation.

The house rests on a new concrete block foundation and is covered with weatherboarding. The windows are one over one sash, with plain board surrounds. The facade door has a three-paned transom and single-paned sidelights. Above, on the second floor, plywood panels indicate where a second floor door has been removed. A door on the W elevation has a shed hood with carved brackets. The roof is covered with asphalt roll siding and has a facade cross gable, a box cornice and jigsaw bargeboards.

The house has two interior brick stove chimneys, one near either, gable end of the house. The facade porch has square wooden posts. The interior arrangement of the house was not investigated.

N of the house is a two-story gable-roofed springhouse, constructed of vertical boards on a high, poured concrete foundation. The interior of the ground level has a trough along the W wall.

NE of the springhouse is a gable-roofed, frame bank barn with a modern silo, and several other farm buildings.

SE of the house is a small graveyard, where Tom Moon, builder of the house is buried. The oldest grave is that of Isabella T. Paugh, who died in 1896 at the age of 61.


